10 Schools Serving Pre-K to High School

Kindergarten

The kindergarten curriculum is broad and rich and introduces children to a wide range of concepts and skills while helping them gain insight into the world. It is organized into three major instructional strands: Language Arts/Social Studies, Mathematics/Science, and Art/Music, Movement and Health.



All eligible kindergarten children attending public school in Westfield enroll at Lincoln School — specially designed for our youngest learners. Lincoln is located at 728 Westfield Ave. Kindergarten is a half-day program where students attend either a morning or afternoon session. There is limited registration for a fee-based wrap-around program that permits AM kindergarteners to remain until 3:20 PM and PM kindergarteners to enter at 9:05 AM.

Integrated Pre-School Program -

is comprised of general education students and students who have been found eligible for special education. General education students are selected for this tuition-based program by lottery.

Westfield High School

WHS (grades 9 - 12) located at 550 Dorian Road is accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the NJ Dept. of Education. It offers a comprehensive program of studies — more than 170 courses — with a strong focus on college preparatory courses. There also are 17 Advanced Placement courses. Students study one or more of the 5 world languages: Spanish, Italian, Mandarin, French, and Latin. More than 80 co-curricular activities are offered in addition to 27 sports programs. 80% of students participate in co-curricular activities.

Elementary

There are 6 neighborhood elementary schools (grades 1-5) in Westfield:

Franklin - 700 Prospect St.
Jefferson - 1200 Boulevard
McKinley - 500 First St.
Tamaques - 641 Willow Grove Rd.
Washington - 900 St. Marks Ave.
Wilson - 301 Linden Ave.

All provide the same curricula and offer the same high quality educational programs. To ensure that all of our children are provided with a strong educational foundation, district supervisors work with principals and teachers from all six schools. Intermediate

The 2 intermediate schools — Edison (800 Rahway Ave.) & Roosevelt (301 Clark St.) — provide a rigorous academic curriculum that is developmentally responsive to the social, emotional and behavioral needs of the adolescent. Both schools have won awards in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math), music competitions and for social awareness.
